**COURSE REQUIREMENTS:**

- 🐾 **Attendance:** Attendance and class participation are mandatory. You are responsible for any information given in class, posted on the class homepage, or sent by email from your instructor. - 🐾 **Homework & Quizzes:** (125 points) Homework will be submitted in several formats throughout the semester. A computer grading program called WebAssign will be used for problems assigned from the text. Written homework showing all work with proper notation will also be assigned. Late homework will not be accepted. Quizzes will be given primarily in chapter 3. All quizzes will have an open notes format with no calculators allowed. Some quizzes will be dropped. There are no make-up quizzes. Although actual total points for this portion of the course will be more than 125 points, your final homework/ quiz grade will be scaled accordingly. You are expected to behave in accordance with the UA's Code of Academic Integrity.
- 🐾 **Preliminary Exam:** (50 points) An algebra exam will be given on Thursday, August 27. This exam will cover manipulative skills and common algebra mistakes. More information can be found on the Calculus Homepage.

- 🐾 **In-Class Exams:** (400 points). Four in-class exams are scheduled for Thursday, September 17; Monday, October 12; Thursday, November 5; and Friday, December 4. Each exam will be worth 100 points. There are no make-up exams. Notify the instructor in advance if you have a conflict with a particular exam date. All electronic devices, particularly cell phones, must be turned off during all exams. Silence and vibration modes are not allowed.
- 🐾 **Final Exam:** (200 points) The final exam is a common department exam scheduled for Monday, December 14 from 2:00 – 4:00 pm.
