Homework & Quizzes: (125 points) Homework will be submitted in two formats throughout the semester. A computer grading program called WebAssign will be used for problems assigned from the text. Hand-written homework, showing all work and using the proper notation, will also be submitted. Late homework will not be accepted. In class quizzes will also be given. All quizzes will have an open notes/ open book format and will be short; usually one or two problems. No calculators will be allowed on the quizzes. There are no make-up quizzes, but some quizzes scores will be dropped. Although the actual total points for this portion of the course will be more than 125 points, your final homework & quiz grade will be scaled accordingly. You are expected to behave in accordance with the UA's Code of Academic Integrity.

Preliminary Exam: (50 points) An algebra exam will be given on Wednesday, September 3. This exam will cover manipulative skills and common algebra mistakes. ALEKS Assessment: (20 points) The Math Department is piloting a new exam for placement into Calculus. To assist the department in gathering data, all Math 124 students will take the exam. If you score at least 20% on the on-line exam, you will earn the full 20 points. Anything

In-Class Exams: (400 points) Four in-class exams are scheduled for **Thursday, September 18; Tuesday, October 14; Thursday, November 6; and Thursday, December 4**. Each exam will be worth 100 points. There are no make-up exams. Notify the instructor in advance if you have a conflict with a particular exam date. All electronic devices, particularly cell phones, must be turned off during all exams; silence and vibration modes are not allowed.

Final Exam: (200 points) The final exam is a common, departmental exam. It is scheduled for **Monday, December 15 from 2:00 – 4:00 pm**. Important Information:

Follow the instructions to create a username and password. You have a 14-day grace period (from the first day of classes) before you need to purchase the WebAssign account online.
